


Reporting directly to the Essex County Library Board, the Chief Librarian is the Chief Executive Officer of the Essex County Library and Secretary/Treasurer to the Board. He/she is responsible for providing visionary leadership and guidance as they organize, direct and control the operations, programs and services that meet the current and future needs of the residents of the seven communities that comprise the County of Essex. As the new Chief Librarian, CEO you will be:

The Chief Executive Officer of the Essex County Library Board as per the Ontario Public Libraries Act, Section 15 (2).

- 1. Responsible for the operation of the library system, including all human resource functions, (i.e. hiring, evaluating, disciplining and terminating staff) and labour relations.
- 2. Prepare monthly Library Board Agendas, Reports and Minutes. Attend monthly Library Board and Council meetings. With the Library Board Chairperson, present and provide information concerning Minutes, Reports and Budget.
- 3. Prepare annual Library budget for submission to the Library Board and County Council, developing cost and revenue projections. Monitor monthly financial reports. Meet with auditors.
- 4. Negotiate collective agreement in consultation with Library Management Team for final ratification by Library Board.
- 5. Interpret and administer the Collective Agreement; respond to all individual grievances at the first or second level of the grievance process and to policy grievances.
- 6. Liaise with Administrators and staff of the seven local municipalities in the County as necessary.
- 7. Advise architects and local municipalities on planning for new library facilities. Monitor construction, purchase furniture and equipment.
- 8. Keep informed of new developments in the field of librarianship. Keep informed and equipped with new legislation, processes and regulations as they relate to financial and / or human resources management handed down by the province and / or developed by the County of Essex.



- 9. Participate in professional/ library organizations (Association of Rural-Urban Public Libraries of Ontario and the Ontario Library Consortium).
- 10. Responsible for collection development and specifically nonfiction adult collection.

To be the new Chief Librarian, CEO you will have the following qualifications:

Education:

Post-graduate degree in Library Science – Master of Library and Information Science from an ALA Accredited University

Experience:

A minimum of 10 years progressive experience in a senior management position in a multi-branch library system, preferably in a unionized environment.

Other:

Knowledge of appropriate federal, provincial and municipal legislation and regulations related to libraries

Excellent strategic planning, analytical and conceptual abilities

Extensive management experience in operations, finance, human resources and technology

Demonstrated oral, written, presentation and reporting skills

Interpersonal skills related to motivating staff to achieve desired outcomes

Proactive with media and active in the local community

Ability to work occasional additional hours in evenings and week-end

A criminal record check is a condition of employment.

Possesses a valid driver's license with reliable transportation.
