The City of Surrey is looking for a Park Technician to help maintain the landscape and horticulture of our parks.

In the position as a Park Technician – Landscape Operations, you will:

- Perform supervisory and technical work in planning, coordinating and supervising the work of crews and contractors
- Prepare annual and seasonal plans, schedules, reports and inspections
- Perform hands on field work in all weather conditions and in accordance with accepted standards, techniques and practices
- Administer contracts for work within the Parks Division
- Perform typical park maintenance duties including, horticulture beds, frontage roads, traffic islands & medians, and passive grass areas

As the successful candidate, you're more than just someone with a green thumb. You are an independent self-starter and a great team member. You're a logical and analytical problem solver with a vast knowledge of the industry. You are a great communicator who can deal with the public, contractors and City staff with diplomacy. You also meet one of the following criteria:

- Completion of a Horticulture Diploma program from a recognized post-secondary institution, with a minimum of three years related experience, OR
- Completion of Grade 12 supplemented by a Horticultural Trades Qualification, supplemented by three years of related progressive experience, OR
- Completion of Grade 12 and a Horticultural Technical Certificate Program (one year full-time) from a recognized post-secondary institution, with additional related academic courses and training including at least one credit course in each of supervision and technical writing, supplemented by four years of related progressive experience, OR
- An acceptable equivalent combination of training and experience.

You must hold a Valid B.C. Driver's License with a safe driving record.
