Duties include supervising the delivery of parks grounds maintenance services, including reviewing effectiveness and making changes, accordingly; developing and implementing policies, procedures and plans; recruiting, supervising and training staff; co-ordinating work schedules to ensure compliance with relevant policies, including Health and Safety; assisting in budget preparation of assigned programs and analyzing and monitoring on a monthly basis; providing technical assistance and advice to staff and the general public; responding to complaints; preparing reports and special analysis; and performing other duties as assigned.

Applicants will have knowledge and skill generally associated with the completion of a Landscape Technology Diploma and/or Horticultural Technicians diploma from a recognized Community College, plus five years of relevant experience, at least three of which should be in a supervisory/management capacity; or have an equivalent combination of education and relevant experience. Possess or ability to obtain the following licenses: Class 03 Pesticide License, Pesticide Technician Program Accredited Examiner, Landscape Exterminator License and Greenhouse/IPM Exterminator License. Possession and maintenance of an Ontario Driver's Licence, minimum Class "DZ" is considered an asset. Must be willing and able to work assigned winter shifts and shift work. First Aid and WHMIS training are mandatory.
