Parkland County has a Permanent, Full-time position available in Fire Services for a Deputy Fire Chief- Life Safety. Reporting to the Fire Chief, you are responsible for the development, implementation, and delivery of the Fire Quality Management Plan including Fire Inspection, Fire Prevention, Fire Investigation and other Life Safety programs within Parkland County. The Deputy Fire Chief- Life Safety is also responsible for assisting in the day-to-day administration, training and operational requirements of Parkland County Fire Services. This includes, but is not limited to, records management system administration; equipment maintenance, replacement and purchasing; develop, implement and maintain standard operating guidelines; and provide Emergency Response Services as required. You will have strong organizational and supervisory skills with the ability to exercise diplomacy and tact in dealing with sensitive and potentially demanding situations and/or information.
