RESPONSIBILITIES

- Provide technical advice, assistance, interpretation and information to the general public, contractors, owners, and registered professionals on matters related to work.

- Suggest alternate methods of complying with codes, regulations and requirements where difficult situations arise.
- · Write reports and correspondence on issues including but not limited to inspections, complaints and investigations
- Post Stop Work Notices on non-compliant properties as required.
- Answer counter and telephone enquiries, including complaints.
- Other job-related duties as required.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Completed Grade 12 supplemented by a post-secondary diploma or certificate in Building Technology or related discipline.
- At least three years' experience in building trades.
- An equivalent combination of training and experience will be considered.
- Technical achievement of the Level I Certification from the Building Officials Association of BC.
- Provincial Red Seal Carpentry Qualification is considered an asset.
- Level II or III Certification is considered an asset.
- Training and experience in municipal bylaw enforcement is considered an asset.
- Communication skills, both verbal and written, to convey information to the public, professionals and other staff.

- Valid and unrestricted driver's license.
